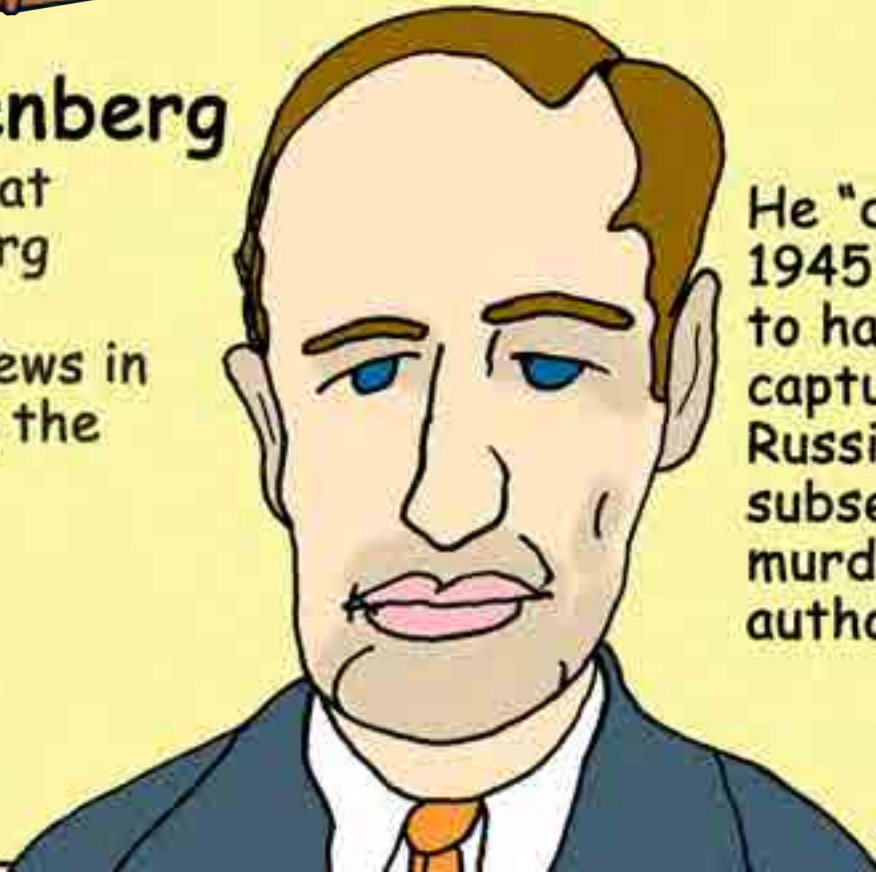

Nahum Sokolov

1861-1936 He was president of the World Zionist Organization and of the Jewish Agency and chairman of the World Zionist Executive. He traveled all over the world propagating Zionist ideas.



Zionist leader, author, journalist, linguist, and translator into Hebrew of Herzl's book "Altneuland" (giving it the title Tel-Aviv.)

Henk Vredeling

1924 - 2007

Was the Minister of
Defense in the Dutch
Parliament in 1973.

attack by the
Egyptian army on the
Jewish holy day of
Yom Kippur.

John Henry Patterson

1867-1947 British soldier, hunter, author and Christian Zionist.

He served as Commander of the Jewish Legion, the first Jewish military force in two thousand years and the basis upon which the IDF was built.



In 2014 in a special operation, his remains, and that of his wife, were brought to Israel to finally carry out his dying request to be buried in Israel alongside his former Jewish Legion soldiers.

Emanuel Deutsch

1829-1873 Polish Jewish orientalist and classical scholar at the British Museum. Known for the efforts he made to promote Semitic studies and for his passion for the cause of Jewish national rebirth.

In 1866 he became George Eliot's tutor in Judaism and Hebrew. He kindled within her his dream of the rebirth of a Jewish nation in the Land of Israel (which became the theme of her prophetic Victorian novel, *Daniel Deronda*).

George Eliot

(Mary Ann Evans)

1819-1890

A major writer
in the Victorian
Age.

In "Daniel Deronda"
her Jewish hero
longs for a rebirth
of the Jewish
Nation in the Land
of Israel.



Theodor Herzl was seen reading the book before the first Zionist Congress. Eliezer Ben-Yehuda reinvented Hebrew as a living language after reading the novel. Chaim Weizmann's assistant Nahum Sokolow said "Deronda paved the way for Zionism."

"Zionism finds in it, for the Jews, a reason to raise their heads, and, taking their stand upon the past, to gaze straightforwardly into the future."

He died in 1941,
seven years before
the establishment of
the State of Israel.

Mickey Marcus

The United States Army colonel and organizer of the Nazi war crimes trials . . . who then became Israel's first general.



He understood how urgently a Jewish homeland was needed for Holocaust survivors so he joined the "impossible" Jewish fight to beat off the invading Arab armies. He was made "Supreme Commander of the Jerusalem Front."

Avraham Stern

Member of the Jewish paramilitary organization Irgun. In September 1940, he founded a breakaway militant Zionist group named Lehi, called the "Stern Gang" by the British authorities.



"The homeland does not need to be freed to solve a 'Jewish Problem' somewhere in the world. It needs to be liberated because it is the homeland."

David Frishman

Writer, poet, and translator. He edited several important Hebrew periodicals, and, in 1913, a book about his travels to Palestine.



In his "the Land of Israel", he described the landscape, the holy places, the pioneers, and the revival of Hebrew as a spoken language.
